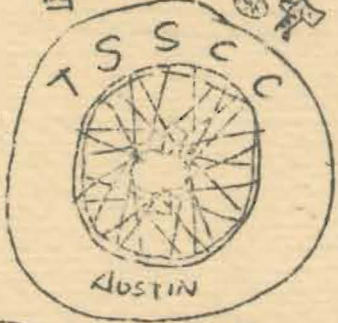

Expenses were \$6.00 for postage and \$93.60 for the 18 trophies awarded, at \$5.20 each. There were 9 trophies not needed and retained for future use, thus not charged against the event. A net profit of \$55.40 was realized and split 50-50 with ARP, with \$27.70 added to the Spokes treasury.

Del Grosenheider, Treasurer, reported a current balance of \$151.41 with no bills outstanding.

"After=~~Meeting~~=Rallye" trophies were presented for the last two events to Mickey Bentley and Del Grosenheider and to Carol Ann Preusse and Phil Gerrow. It was pointed out by our Trophy Chairman, Larry Appleby, that Carol Ann's trophy was formerly a "Best Bird in Show" trophy and had been donated by Mary Blundell's father.

The next Spokes Gymkhana will be conducted by Phil Gerrow at the Northfair Rylander's parking lot at N. Lamar and Airport Blvd. on Sunday, June 14, 1970. He previews that it will be the course in miniature of the annual June Sprints at Road America, Wisconsin.

Larry Appleby will be the Rallyemaster of the next "After=~~Meeting~~=Rallye". He warns that in the middle of the route will be a mini-gimmick gymkhana. This is designed to possibly break the semi-monopoly of the championship series winners.

Under new business, it was approved that we spend \$10.00 to get David Pound to create at the Checquered Flag, a "Spokes Corner" with our large trophy, our Scrapbook on an appropriate stand, the tri-colored Spokes Shield, etc. near the plaques of the Championship Series winners.

The meeting was adjourned and followed by the showing of "The Eagles Fly at Indy" and a film on antique cars.

With the fifth consecutive running of the Spokes' President's Prix behind us, it seems that the event is now firmly established under the status of a club "tradition." The event held on July 19 at Gulf Mart's parking lot was, however, far from traditional.

The course that our beloved President Anthony Ball layed out was, in my opinion at least, a good one. It was also long, confusing, often illogical, both fast and slow, mostly tight, continually frustrating -- and fun to drive! Unlike many of our past gymkhanas, this course was difficult for everyone. There did seem to be almost unanimous agreement that it was a super tire-eater and a general pain to one and all.

The turn-out of around 40 entries was not bad for a hot July afternoon and the A Sedan boys were there in force. Since the course was probably best suited to a good competition-prepared Sprite (none entered), the pony cars may have found the course less than ideal, however. But it was the President's Prix and he does drive one of them funny little foreign sports cars, so...a wide open course was not likely to happen.

It was a good event, Tony --- no matter what all those other people said about it.

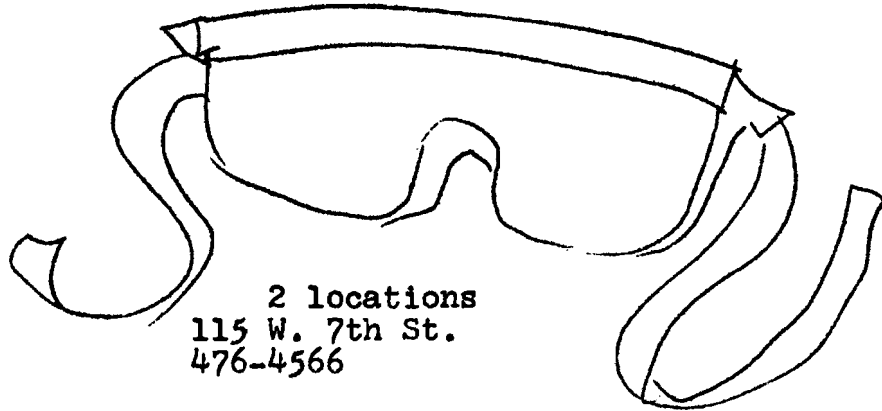

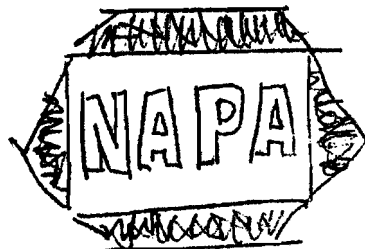
