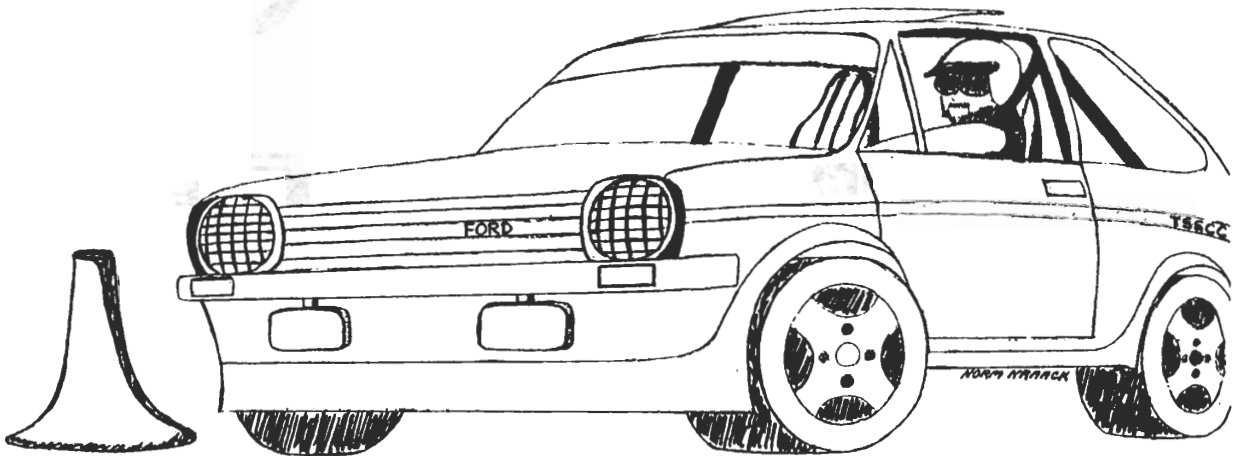

Since the duties of each office are ambiguous at times, read on and you will gain some insight into the responsibilities you will inherit if selected for one of them.

THE PRESIDENT is the leader, the instigator, the peace maker, the arbitrator. S/He organizes activities and gets members involved. As President of the TEXAS SPOKES SPORTS CAR CLUB, you can have a large impact on the image we portray to the rest of Austin if not the rest of Texas. Special meetings will be called and topics chosen largely at your discretion. You will be searched out for advice, direction, and support. You will lead all meetings and insure that club by-laws are followed. Then as a past president, your comments will be heard and respected. Now that is a glamorous job. But, don't be fooled. All those other little responsibilities of the board will require your deligation of responsibilities to the right people. So, it won't be a sit back and watch year. But, have fun and.....Thanks.

Nominations for President from the nominating committee are David Wendt and Joe Roddy.

THE VICE-PRESIDENT is the record keeper, safety inspector, equipment procurer, and brainstormer. The record keeping you will be responsible for are those precious standings for end of year trophies. As treasurer, you will be responsible for taking entry and membership fees, getting them deposited, accounting for all expenses. If nothing else, you'll learn a lot about accounting.

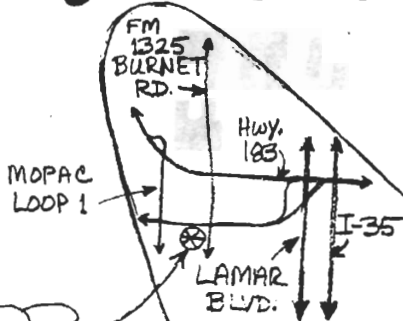

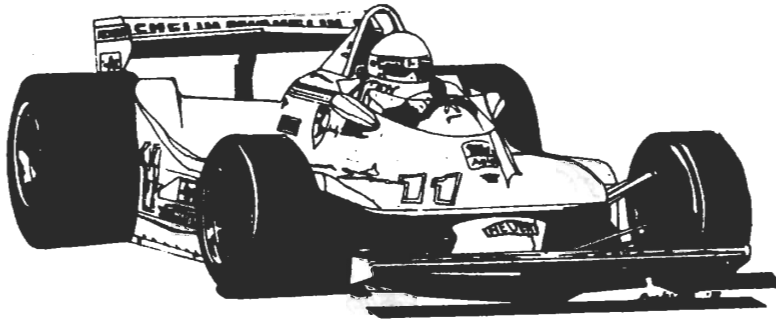

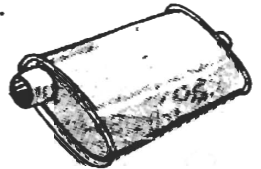
